Jetty/Marinelli Beach <u>Update on Progress on Implementation of the March 2024 Recommendations¹</u> and Compliance with Accessibility Standards²

Note: The original March 2024 recommendations are in black conventional text. *Progress report observations and findings are in red italics, with further recommendatons in bold, red italics.*

- Consider adding one additional accessible space near the entrance to the beach. <u>Undetermined</u>.
- 2. Implement the current plans in conjunction with East Chop Beach Club mentioned in the survey creating an accessible route from the parking to the high-water mark. The entrance should have signage indicating it is accessible.

This has been completed. A series of very well installed 5-foot wide beach mats running over 700 feet from the parking area to the beach and to the high-water mark was completed for use during the 2024 summer season. Not part of the recommendations but of note was the installation of a hose hook up to rinse off before exiting the walkway. The set up is accessible as well as the hose attachment is about 3 feet off the ground and reachable and usable by someone in a wheelchair.

With regard to the walkway there is a small area at the beginning route where there about a 4-5 foot gap between the road pavement and the first beach mat. Most of gap is not a problem. It is made up of hardened dirt and is stable. However about a foot just before the mat, the surface softens and there is an abrupt rise of about an inch or more onto the mat, exceeding the ½ inch required maximum. This is a simple fix, and It is recommended this be addressed for next season if not earlier.

- 3. Consider having one large beach wheelchair, and if lifeguards are present, one floating wheelchair. Such wheelchairs have been ordered for use beginning in the 2025 season.
